Caterpillar Room

August - Happy Birthday to Emma who turns one this month! We hope you have a lovely birthday.

We are continuing our exploration of the black white and red area this month looking at some new objects and also doing some foot painting for our display. This will be very messy! Newborns can see from birth, just not as clearly as an older child or adult. Until your child is about six months of age, he will respond best to bold, contrasting colours and graphics. That's why it's important to provide your baby with toys that feature the visual extremes of black, white and red. These high-contrast colours will captivate and hold baby's attention, encouraging visual development as well as physical activity – like wiggling, kicking, and arm waving.

We will also be thinking about holidays as well all take a break and visit some amazing places. The children will be in the sand and water to continue to explore new textures and recreate experiences they have had on their holidays. Also getting the younger ones used to the feel of the sand if they have never sat in it or manipulated it before as it can feel very strange. Children learn through their environment and sensory experiences, such as sand and water, as this helps to stimulate the brain by sending signals that help strengthen neural pathways. This is so important for all types of learning and the best part is the children love it!

September -We will now be focussing on physical skills. Developing skills ready for crawling and walking with the younger children, and the older children perfecting their running, jumping and climbing. We will do this by lots of outdoor play, Forest school and music ad movement sessions with Kimbles.

October - Happy Birthday to James and Beau who both turn 2 this month and will be leaving us for the Butterfly room. All children have settle sessions to prepare them for the next room and make the transition easy for everybody.

This month will be about Autumn and natural objects. Exploring leaves as they change colour and texture and looking at different treasure baskets.



Butterfly Room

This September we have quite a few new starters in the Butterfly room so would like to welcome them and we hope you settle in and enjoy nursery life. The Butterfly room can be very noisy and very busy but the children are all very welcoming and you will have lots of fun!

To get to know everyone we are continuing the All about me topic, and discussing family members and others who are important in our lives. Children can bring photos in to add to the family book and Travelling Ted will be going off on his adventures again to get to know your families and give the children something to share with their friends.

The preschool room are learning about People who help us and having a visit from a Police Officer!! The Butterflies are going to join in this visit too and get to meet the police Officer and see what they carry as part of their uniform. Hopefully we get to see a police car too!! And if we are lucky we may get a visit from the Firemen.

The topic table within the room is going to be focussing on numbers 1-10. The children will use animals to support their recognition of numbers, select quantities and count out objects.

Alongside this the children will be doing lots of creative and sensory activities such as jelly play, shaving foam painting and gluing and activities for Bonfire night making fireworks and sparkly pictures to display!



Ladybird Room

September sees the return of all the funded children and a few new starters - welcome back We hope you have had a fantastic summer and we look forward to hearing all your stories! Faye and Kirsty will be taking time to get to know everyone this term and assess their development needs.

We are starting the term off talking about people who help us. Ensuring we talk to the children about stranger danger and who they need to go to if they are in trouble. We have a visit planned from the Police and maybe the fire service where the children will get to look at their uniforms and equipment and ask them any questions they may have. It's not very often the children meet a real police officer! This will also be linked to Bonfire night and safety around the bonfires.

The children will also be talking about Harvest, learning what it is about and why we celebrate it. We will have our own Harvest collection at nursery and will be taking the food to the food bank on the bus - Which will be very exciting!!

This year is the 100th anniversary of the battle of the Somme. The 100th anniversary provides an opportunity to commemorate the service and sacrifice of those who lost their lives in the battle. The children are going to decorating soldiers to display at the National Memorial Arboretum to join in these celebrations and we will be talking to them about Remembrance Day and why it is so important. We will also visit the memorial in the village.

Our literacy focus is:

- Listens to and joins in with stories and poems, one to one and also in small groups.
- Beginning to be aware of the way stories are structured.
- Listens to stories with increasing attention and recall.

We are hoping to have a visit to the library bus so the children can choose some stories of their own to look at in the setting. Introducing the new and younger children to the structure of stories and how we look at and handle books correctly.

Our numeracy focus is:

• Shapes - naming selecting and finding shapes confidently in our environment.
