Firstly, we would like to say a big welcome to all of our new children who have joined us recently, we are thoroughly enjoying getting to know you all. Also, we hope you've had a lovely summer and can't wait to hear all about your summer adventures.



'WOW!' Moments - Parents/Carers! Your child is truly amazing and throughout your child's life they will make some mighty significant steps on their journey of development. Together, we would like to show the children how proud we all are of these moments and celebrate their individual achievements. These are what we call at nursery our 'WOW!' moments. So, if outside of nursery your child has perhaps tried something new for the first time (food, drink, standing,

walking, talking, using the potty), or maybe enjoyed a trip or activity, please fill in a star or tell a member of staff so that we can put it on our WOW Board - you can also share a photo of special moments through the Blossom App. EYFS - it is important for parents and early years settings to have a strong and respectful partnership. This sets the scene for children to thrive in the early years.



Holidays and Absences - Although nursery attendance is not statutory, it is important for parents/carers to report their child's absence to nursery on the first day. Nursery has to follow guidelines set out by the local authority regarding the regular attendance of all children. Please report all absences on our landline number 01543 493433.



Appropriate clothing – As the winter months approach, please can you provide your child/ren with a warm coat that is waterproof, hat, scarf, gloves and wellies. As always, please ensure that your child's belongings are labelled, this means that belongings do not get lost or mixed up. Baby room asks for shoes every day, even those who are not yet walking to give them the opportunity to cruise along in the garden/ride on the wheeled

EYFS - We have received some lovely feedback regarding our transition to in the moment planning, involving weekly assessments and the opportunity for parent meetings. Our children and practitioners are benefiting greatly from this transition and we hope you have found our parent meetings with your child's key person useful. We welcome our friends from the Butterfly room who are transitioning over to us in the upcoming months and will be building relationships and getting them used to the preschool routine. We will be encouraging them to recognise their own names which will promote independence when entering nursery and putting their bags on their own pegs, knowing their own drawers etc.

5th November - Bonfire night, we have lots activities based around bonfire night including the story of Guy Fawkes. We will be creating our own firework pictures, rockets and much more.

11th November - Remembrance Day, as this is such an important date, we will have activities and stories based around those we remember we will be creating Poppies, sensory play based on this date and much more.

December - Build up to Christmas. We will be setting out lots of exciting activities based around Christmas. We will also be practising for our nativity performance! We cannot wait to show you our singing voices and acting skills!
