We had a good turnout of Grandparents for the babies when we celebrated Grandparents Day so a big thanks to everyone that came. A few were a little unsure why their Grandparents were here but it was lovely for you all to join in and we hope you all had fun. Throughout November the children will be exploring Autumn by looking at leaves, conkers and acorns and exploring natural objects and textures. We will also be doing lots of messy activities as sensory development and stimulation are important with this age range. Some children can be cautious of new objects and sensations so we do a lot of work as a group so they can watch their friends join in too. We will also be using the outdoor environment and letting the children explore and play in the leaves and mud!

In December we will be focussing on Christmas and winter themed activities such as ice play, frozen shaving foam and ice cubes, making glittery pictures and using Christmas resources again as stimulation for the babies to explore textures and use their senses.

We look forward to settling everyone back into nursery after a lovely Christmas with family.



Butterfly Room

The children in Butterfly room are looking forward to a creative few months.

For children in need they will be joining in and dressing up as a hero for the day. This can be a superhero, a cartoon character or someone who is important to them. They will be making lots of yummy biscuits and also pictures of Pudsey Bear. For Bonfire night the children will make splatter pictures like fireworks and bake rice crispy cakes with sparkly sprinkles.

Forest School sessions this half term will include fires in case anyone is going to a bonfire so that the children are aware of the dangers of fire and they can also share with their friends the fire circle rules.

For Christmas we will be making lots of crafty things...calendars, cards, gifts and using our senses to explore Christmas treasure baskets.

We are also hoping to take the children out in to the community for a walk where we will be looking for different shapes and signs and listening to sounds as a start to their letters and sounds work that they will continue in preschool.



Ladybird Room

The preschool children really enjoyed having their Grandparents come and play, they have been looking at the photos and talking about what we did. A massive thank you to all that came - it meant a lot to the children. Ladybirds have also been on a few walks around the village and looking at the local community. They love to get out and about and a big thank you to Alfie's mum for coming along and helping. If anyone is available to help please let us know.

Throughout the next few months we will be doing a range of activities. Remembrance Sunday is at the beginning of November and we will be doing Poppy pictures and talking to the children about remembering people who are special to us.

Bonfire and firework pictures will be made ready for Bonfire night using lots of glitter and sparkle! The children will also learn about the safety around a bonfire. This will be reinforced during Forest School when remembering the fire circle rules.

Then we will be talking about Diwali and introducing the children to the concept of other beliefs and festivals. As it is the festival of lights we will look at torches and see what effect they have in light and dark, teaching the children how to use and operate them themselves and make Diva candle holders out of clay so the children will all have a light to take home. It also incorporates patterns and the children will look at a range of patterns and mark making techniques and have a go at making their own.

Alongside this we will be preparing for Christmas! The preschool children will be doing a nativity for parents to come and watch so we will be busy practicing our songs and performance as well as exploring the theme of Christmas and winter and all things cold and sparkly!

Our focus for Literacy at the moment is:

- Recognition of initial sounds in words and the children's names
- Recognition of the written name
- Understanding of fiction and non fiction books.

Our focus for Mathematics is measurement. We will be measuring objects and each other, looking at sizes and ordering shortest to tallest and smallest to biggest. It would be lovely, if the opportunity arises, to recap on these areas with your children).
