Firstly, we would like to give all our new children and their families a warm welcome into the Caterpillar room as we begin our journey together to support and guide your child/ren through their development. Here are some of the things we will be doing with your children over the next few months.

In January, we will be exploring winter themed activities. We will be exploring ice play as we use our senses to explore the ice, we will also be exploring snow using our feet to feel the fluffy snow between our toes. We will be making our very own winter themed sensory baskets and bottles for the children to explore.
