

'WOW!' Moments - Parents/Carers! Your child is truly amazing and throughout your child's life they will make some mighty significant steps on their journey of development. Together, we would like to show the children how proud we all are of these moments and celebrate their individual achievements. These are what we call at nursery our 'WOW!' moments. So, if outside of nursery your child has perhaps

tried something new for the first time (food, drink, standing, walking, talking, using the potty), or maybe enjoyed a trip or activity, please fill in a star for the WOW Board, you can also share a photo of special moments through the Blossom App. EYFS - it is important for parents and early years settings to have a strong and respectful partnership. This sets the scene for children to thrive in the early years.



Holidays and Absences - Although nursery attendance is not statutory, it is important for parents/carers to report their child's absence to nursery on the first day. Nursery has to follow guidelines set out by the local authority regarding the regular attendance of all children. Please report all absences on our landline number 01543 493433.



Appropriate clothing - As the warmer weather approaches, please ensure that you provide sun hats and sun cream. It is recommended that after 12 months, sun cream is discarded of, due to the UV protection not being as effective after this time. Therefore, we require a new bottle and any remaining sun cream from last year will be disposed of. As always, please ensure that your child's belongings are labelled, this means that belongings do not get lost or mixed up. Baby room asks for shoes every day for the babies, even those

who are not yet walking to give them the opportunity to cruise along in the garden/ride on the wheeled toys. Thank you.



Toys from home - We understand that children often want to bring toys in from home to show their friends, however to avoid these getting lost or broken, we would appreciate it if you could encourage your children to leave them in a special place at home or hand them back to you on drop off.

Ladybird Room

Welcome to the Ladybird room, it has been wonderful to see your pictures on Blossom over the last term of your Christmas and Easter celebrations, or all of the fun things you get up to on the weekend! Our children absolutely love looking through them and talking about what they have been doing! Also, a big well done for all of your Easter bonnet creations, they were fantastic and we could see how hard you worked on them!

As we move through the summer term, we have lots of exciting things coming up! We have our caterpillars due in May for the children to explore the life cycle of a butterfly.

The children have been learning about the King in our conversation station and what happens on Coronation Day! The children have shown a big interest in reading through the fact card and pictures to learn about the royal family and have been talking about the different castles and buildings. The children have enjoyed taking this learning into their play as they take on the role of a king, queen or princess and building castles using resources around the room.

We have some lovely activities planned for Father's Day so keep your eyes peeled for some cards and gifts coming your way as well as a stay and play session!

SPORTS DAY! We hope to see the children participate in this year's sports day and the lead up to it! We have some fun games for them to take part in and we can't wait to have some fun in the sun!

We have a large group of preschool children leaving us this year, as sad as we are that they are leaving us, it is certainly time for them to flourish in reception and expand their learning! We will be focusing on school readiness and we will be changing the role play area into a small classroom for the children.

We are looking to promote independence in the run up to children going to school in September, this includes:

- > Getting dressed independently we provide numerous opportunities for children to dress themselves such as putting on their own coats, shoes, forest school clothing and role play costumes.
- Personal belongings we encourage children to take care of their own belongings such as putting their bags and coats on pegs, and personal items in their trays etc this encourages children to take on a responsibility to check their own areas at the end of the day.
- > Name recognition children's names are displayed all over the nursery environment and we focus on children recognising the first initial sound in their name and other words.
- > Emotions we help children to understand and regulate their own emotions by talking through big feelings and use stories to help develop their language and understanding.
- > Carpet time activities encouraging children to sit for a period of time and listen to a story, engaging in questions and learning how to take it in turns to talk.

Top tips for parents:

- Involve your child in the process of buying school uniform and other items such as bags and shoes (remember to buy shoes that children can take on and off independently)
- Encourage your child to manage their own personal hygiene e.g to wipe their own bottom, washing their hands and to be able to wipe their own nose

We are looking forward to planning the graduation party for the school leavers and the theme will be confirmed soonl

If parents can let us know what school their child will be attending in September a swell as their last day with us that would be great.
