Funding information

Childcare funding can be applied for via Gov.uk, as it currently stands eligible working parents of 9months-2 years olds can receive up to 15 hours childcare funding per week. This is due to increase to 30 hours with new entitlements for Working Parents commencing September 2025. If your child already receives childcare funding then your current 15-hour code will automatically change over to a 30hour code if you have reconfirmed your eligibility as required. As a result of this increased funding from September if you would like your child to increase their sessions/days from September please email your requests to info@thepoppinsdaynursery.co.uk.

All working parents in receipt of funding need to reconfirm their eligibility every 3 months. This means that any parents that do apply before the 1st June 2025 will need to reconfirm their eligibility prior to the 31st August to be able to take up a place from the 1st September. Once you have your code, please can you pass it on to us along with your NI number so that we can claim funding on your behalf.

The earliest that a parent can apply for a code is 16 weeks before they turn the age of eligibility.

Please be advised that funding covers childcare only and extra charges do apply - please speak with Louise/Debbie if you have any queries regarding funding or bills.

<u>Health & Safety</u>

Illness: Please DO NOT send your child to nursery if they are unwell. We also ask you NOT to bring your child to nursery if they have taken any medication in the morning. If they have suffered from diarrhoea or sickness, please keep them at home for at least 48 hours after the last episode of sickness or diarrhoea. If your child requires antibiotics, we require them

to stay at home for the first 24 hours for close observation before returning to nursery if they are fit and well to do so.

Sun safety

We will be spending lots of time in the garden in the summer months, exploring a variety of activities in the lovely weather. From being builders, to gardeners, to bug hunters, splashing in the water and building those all-important gross motor skills in climbing.

To ensure your child is protected as we welcome the warmer months, please supply your own (ideally 4-star with an SPF of 30 or above), clearly labelled sun cream for staff to use. Parents/carers are still required to thoroughly apply a layer of sun cream to your little one before they arrive at nursery to ensure maximum coverage and protection.

We also recommend that your child has an appropriate sunhat for nursery, which protects their head and shades their face, neck, and ears (e.g., a broad-brimmed or Legionnaire-style hat).

*Sun creams with nut-derived oils in them are banned to help keep everyone with allergies at nursery safe. Please do not apply this to your child before they attend nursery.

<u>Gates</u>

Can all parents/carers please ensure that they close the nursery gates behind them.

Toys from home

We understand that children often want to bring toys in from home to show their friends, however to avoid these getting lost or broken, we would appreciate it if you could encourage your children to leave them in a special place at home or hand them back to you on drop off.

Holidays and Absences

Although nursery attendance is not statutory, it is important for parents/carers to report their child's absence to nursery on the first day.
